
## case study Somnium at Bingie

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**Location** Bingie, South Coast NSW Architect Eoghan Lewis Architects **Builder** Luke Price – Flair Homes Photography Matt Horspool – etchd

## **Clients Needs**

Located on an incredible stretch of land overlooking Coila Lake and the Tasman Sea, this striking property is a hidden country retreat. The vision for Somnium at Bingie was to create a sanctuary for the clients as a holiday home, as well as a luxury retreat for guests. The house needed to comfortably accommodate up to 15 people, while achieving a pared-back aesthetic and capturing the spirit of connection to the natural environment similar to that found when camping.

For economic and environmental reasons, the team at Eoghan Lewis Architects worked with the two existing rundown structures – a brick project home and a timber barn. Retaining as much material as possible, the structures were reinvented as a family of pavilions linked by covered entrances and courtyards. A new concrete pavilion was constructed for the living area, taking advantage of the northern aspect and views of Gulaga (Mount Dromedary) and Coila Lake.

Acacia was commissioned to provide a suite of external sliding windows, doors and screens for the bedrooms and living spaces, plus a series of fixed, louvre and casement windows, all in Spotted Gum.

## Challenges

The project raised several challenges which required considerable expertise, careful design and complex engineering solutions to overcome. The exposed headland location on the NSW South Coast, a site vulnerable to weather conditions and bushfires, contributed to the project's challenges.

Maximising views and creating seamless indoor/outdoor connections were key elements of the architect's design. As such, external face-sliding windows and doors were required on openings in the living area and bedrooms. As these units cannot be fully tested prior to installation, meticulous design and precision craftsmanship was essential.

Provisions for double-glazing as well as deep door frames, sashes and reveals was an additional challenge, as the required FSC approved timbers are only available in standard section sizes.

Possibly the most challenging element of the project, however, was the design of the complex sliding corner window. Free from any central vertical support structures, the room essentially becomes corner-less when the window is opened, facilitating a phenomenal unobstructed view of the landscape beyond. Achieving an adequate weather seal was difficult, yet essential, given the exposed nature of the home's location.

	Detailed CAD designs and meticulous craftsmanship ensured the external face-sliding windows and doors all functioned perfectly upon installation, and most importantly, were easy to operate despite the considerable weight of the double-glazed units.
	The deep door frames, thick sashes and deep reveals required were achieved through industry leading lamination techniques and engineering solutions, providing the bespoke appearance required.
	Acacia designed a unique continuous weather seal solution for the corner window unit, ensuring protection from inclement weather.
Outcome	The beautiful timber tones of the Spotted Gum windows and doors used throughout Somnium at Bingie deliver warmth to the minimal interiors. The sliding window, doors and battened screens, as well as the operable high level windows in the living area provide guests with the ability to customise natural airflow and light penetration depending on the time of day, seasonality and climatic conditions on the exposed headland site. The home is a sanctuary that nurtures its occupants and celebrates the surrounding landscape.
