





Bi-fold and Multi-fold Doors

Create flexible spaces in your project, even linking the indoors to the outdoors, with our bi-fold doors. They'll redefine spaces — create an al fresco zone, join rooms or a have more intimate area with a gentle glide of the panels. They can open with two or up to 16 panels. You choose the configuration that best fits. Your choice too, whether they stack on both sides or just one. You can adjust Acacia bi-fold or multi-fold doors vertically and laterally for long-term hassle free operation.



Double Doors (French Doors)

Enhance your design with well-placed custom-made double doors. They can be retro-fitted seamlessly into the original building, or can be part of your initial design.



Hinged Doors

You'd know these are doors that fit snugly into a door jamb with two or more hinges on one side. It's the norm for the front or back entry of homes.. Heavier doors demand strong and more hinges. You might need doors that swing one way or hinged doors that swing both ways.



Pivot Doors

For a wide and generous opening, the more modern pivot doors could be the go. They pivot — or swing — on a point, top and bottom. This means they don't need a door frame as such. Pivot doors are usually heavy and made from timber or glass. The pivoting makes them easier to open and close than a standard door. And, there's a lot less hardware that goes into a pivot than a hinged door. They're a perfect fit for contemporary designs.



Sliding Doors

Have you considered how a quality custom-made sliding door can add elegant simplicity to your project? Our doors will glide beautifully on twin-wheel ball-bearing rollers that fit snugly into U-channel weather guides at the top. Maybe multi-sliders that have a self-draining slide system will fit the bill for you.





Awning Windows

A window hinged at the top so it can open outwards from the base is an awning window. That's your rain protection and ventilation issues sorted. You can select from a range of finishes for high quality winders or perhaps traditional friction stays and locking bars. Electric winders are ideal for hi-lite awning windows, too.



Bi-fold and Multi-fold Windows

Make a stylish statement with Bi-fold or Multi-fold windows in two, three or 16-panel configurations. They'll open smoothly and precisely on the vertical or horizontal plane. Picture them opening up wide to maximise a gorgeous view and allow more air in. Our customised design means you can have the benchtop flowing through the opening to make an outdoor servery. Multi-fold windows are your passport to uninterrupted views – those window frames are

out of sight, neatly stacked

on one side.



Casement Windows

Go for a classic look that maximises airflow into your building. Casement windows allow more control to capture a breeze from any direction. Unlike awing windows, which open from the base and only a few degrees, casement windows are side opening and usually open fully outwards. You can open them to the left or right. Think of the whole window opening. That's handy above a kitchen sink. And casement windows can have two or more panes. You'll often find them in heritage properties.




Double Hung Windows

Customers love their versatility for bringing light and air into a room. Double-hung windows work well where greater air ventilation is needed. They suit slimline applications and regularly feature on multistorey residential and architecturally designed homes, and where you need great ventilation.



Fixed Glass Windows

Let your imagination soar with the possibilities of an architectural fixed glass window. Frame the view and let yourself bask in natural light and warmth.





Louvre Windows

These are perfect for the Australian climate allowing maximum airflow when opened. Think of built-in verandas with louvre windows offering control over airflow, capturing the breeze wherever it's coming from, providing maximum air. When the panes are horizontal, you have a near-clear vista. They'll create superb ventilation and views if installed from floor to ceiling. In bathrooms they work so efficiently you won't need a fan. Louvre windows are a stylish fit for classic or contemporary homes. Modern versions easily glide open and can be key-locked for security.



Sashless Windows

Meld a touch of modernity into your design with a sashless window for the clearest view an opening window can offer. More class with glass. There's no bulky frame to obscure your view. Boost control, air circulation and ventilation as the glass glides up and down simultaneously. How it works is with two moving panes of counterbalanced glass in a double-hung system. Those panes can move either vertically or horizontally depending on the configuration. So, you can glide the window open easily at the top and the bottom simultaneously, letting air in above and below; or with the other configuration, you'd glide the glass to create a gap at each side. Comfort options with availability in single or double

glazed glass, two, three

or four panes.



Sliding Windows

Sliding windows are the smart pick for functionality. Opening from side to side, they work well where you have wide rather than tall spaces. Double-hung windows, which open at the top and bottom, are your best fit for tall spaces. Here's why sliding windows are functional: They glide easily — the sashes run on highly engineered twin-wheel ball-bearing rollers. Flexible options to have one or up to six panels of glass. Allows you to improve airflow and natural light into the room.
